YOUR DIGIPEN STUDENT ACCOUNT



Your student account gives you access to a range of computer and IT resources, including:

- · Your DigiPen student email
- On-campus computer workstations
- Colleague Self Service
- · Scholarship Universe
- Online coursework tools (such as Moodle)

You should have received your student account login credentials via email shortly after your acceptance. If you did not receive this email, or if you need it to be re-sent, please contact the Office of Admissions at *admissions@digipen.edu*.

Keep your student account login information safe and secure. You will use this account throughout your entire time at DigiPen.

HOW TO SET UP YOUR EMAIL

Using your student account credentials, you can now access your DigiPen email by going to: **webmail.digipen.edu**

You can access your email directly from your browser using RoundCube, or you can follow the instructions for setting up an email client, such as Thunderbird.

COLLEAGUE SELF SERVICE

Colleague Self Service is the online service you will use during your time at DigiPen to update your contact information, register for classes, and manage other important academic information. You can log in using your DigiPen student account username and password.

HOW TO LOG IN TO COLLEAGUE SELF SERVICE FOR THE FIRST TIME

- 2. Enter your:
 - DigiPen student account username
 - DigiPen student account password

REGISTERING FOR CLASSES

Registration for fall 2023 classes will open in late March.

Detailed information, including registration dates and instructions, will be sent to your DigiPen email address. Keep an eye on your inbox!



YOUR STUDENT ID BADGE



DigiPen's campus remains locked throughout the day. To gain entry, you'll need your student ID badge, which unlocks approved exterior and interior doors around the building.

Upload a photo for your student ID badge:

Please follow these instructions on how to take and upload your own ID badge photo.

You must upload a photo for your student ID badge no later than **August 1**. We will have your student ID badge ready and waiting for you at New Student Orientation. Photos uploaded after this date may not be processed in time for Orientation.

HOW TO UPLOAD YOUR STUDENT ID BADGE PHOTO

- Take a passport-format photo of yourself (i.e., vertically oriented, facing forward, and containing your head and shoulders) in front of a white background.
- 2. Log in to the Application Portal at: connect.digipen.edu/apply
- On your checklist, click the "Student ID Badge Photo Submission" form. This will take you to a form with instructions and a photo upload option. Upload your photo as a JPEG (.jpg) file. Image size must be at least 600by-800 pixels and no bigger than 768-by-1024 pixels.
- 4. You will be notified if your self-prepared photo was accepted. If your photo is not accepted, we will tell you what was wrong with your photo (for example, too dark or blurry, not a white background, etc.). You will then be able to upload a new photo that complies with the specifications requested.

We know you're a creative and unique person, but your student ID badge is not the place to express your individuality — it's just to get you in the building.

Please do not submit a photo containing any of the following: props, costumes, inappropriate poses, hats, background drawings/text, or sunglasses.

Examples of acceptable photos: head and shoulders only in front of a white backdrop

Laptop Requirement

SUMMER ASSIGNMENTS

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If you are enrolled in the **BFA** in **Digital Art and Animation** or the **BA** in **Game Design** degree program, you are encouraged to participate in optional summer practice assignments to prepare for required first-semester courses.

#### **ART 101 - Practice and Preparation**

Students in the **BFA** in **Digital Art and Animation** program can view instructional videos on the DigiPen website to help prepare for **ART 101**. Even though this summer practice assignment is optional, it is strongly recommended that you complete it in order to ensure that you are adequately prepared for the foundation art classes in the first semester. Your assignment may take you multiple weeks to complete, so we encourage you to get started as soon as possible.

## **YOUR HIGH** SCHOOL, COLLEGE, OR **MILITARY TRANSCRIPT**

If you recently graduated from high school or college, ask your school to send us your final transcript. This version of your transcript should list your date of graduation or conferment of degree. Similarly, if you have completed any college or military education courses since you submitted your application to DigiPen, please send us official transcripts for that coursework. All transcripts should be delivered through a verified electronic transcript delivery service such as Parchment, eSCRIP, National Student Clearinghouse, or SCOIR. You can also have your transcripts mailed in a sealed envelope directly from the high school or college to the address below.

### **FERPA**



The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that protects your education records. Once you start college or reach 18 years of age, your parents no longer have an automatic right to access your records without your consent. This includes information such as your grades, class schedules, tuition, and Financial Aid information. In order to designate who may have access to your records, you need to create a proxy via the Proxy Module found in Colleague Self Service.

Under FERPA, some student information such as name and dates of attendance are considered public or Directory Information. According to the FERPA guidelines, DigiPen may release this information to any third-party that inquires. If you do not want DigiPen to release this information, you can enact a "FERPA Block" through Colleague Self Service (CSS) via the link found in the Proxy Module.

## DIGIPEN HOUSING AND RESIDENCE LIFE

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DigiPen Housing and Residence Life offers furnished, off-campus living accommodations to a limited number of students based on application priority. Housing is not guaranteed for all applicants, and applicants may be placed on a waitlist if all available spaces are filled.

We partner with local apartment complexes and manage all leases and services for our housing residents.

Services include:

- 24/7 on-call emergency support
- · Assigned resident assistants
- Utility and maintenance management
- High-speed internet
- Monthly community engagement opportunities

OUR PROGRAMS FOR 2023-2024

- Early Arrival Program (pre-fall semester)
 - The Early Arrival Program (EAP) is a first-year program in partnership with DigiPen's Office of Student Engagement and is offered in two options (see next page).
- Academic Year Housing (fall and spring semesters)
 - Academic Year Housing is offered as an eight-month contract, spanning from August to April (covers all times classes are in session, as well as holiday breaks).
 Applications open in February of each year.
- Spring Start Housing (spring semester only)
 - Spring-Start Housing is offered to new and continuing students as a four-month contract. Applications open in October of each year.

EARLY ARRIVAL PROGRAM

The Early Arrival Program (EAP) is a partnership program between DigiPen Housing and Residence Life and DigiPen's Office of Student Engagement. This program is exclusive to incoming first-year students and is offered in two options:

Events Only and Events & Housing.

EAP provides you with an opportunity to meet new friends, learn more about the Redmond area, and become familiar with faculty and staff before the academic year begins. Several co-curricular experiences are planned, including day trips within the Redmond and greater Seattle area, as well as social nights.

Program Dates: August 12-18, 2023

ELIGIBILITY

Events Only: Any incoming first-year student is eligible to apply.

Events & Housing: Any incoming first-year student who has also applied to the 2023-2024 Academic Year Housing program is eligible to apply. (If your 2023-2024 Academic Year Housing application is cancelled/withdrawn, you will automatically be switched to the "Events Only" option unless otherwise noted.)

HOW TO APPLY

The EAP application is hosted on the same portal used to apply to DigiPen Housing (*housingapp.digipen.edu/housing*) and follows the same application timeline as the 2023-2024 Academic Year program (see previous page).

COST

Events Only: \$1,000 USD* Events & Housing: \$1,500 USD*

*Please note that the cost of EAP is not covered by financial aid.

HOUSING ROOM OPTIONS AND RATES

Although all residents are asked to select a Room Type preference in their application, residents are ultimately assigned to an apartment depending on availability and priority.

Prices shown below are for the 2023-2024 academic year and do not guarantee rates for the 2024-2025 academic year or future years.

Payment is due in full at the beginning of each term and is collected by the DigiPen Accounting Department. For the 2023-2024 academic year, the cost is billed in two parts, once in August and once in December.

DISABILITY SUPPORT SERVICES

DigiPen Institute of Technology is committed to providing equal access to all of its programs, courses, activities, events, and services. As required by the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 as amended, as well as Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (P.L. 93-112) as amended (P.L. 93-16), DigiPen will provide reasonable accommodations to qualified students with disabilities.

DigiPen's Disability Support Services Office (DSS Office) and its staff are appointed by the president of DigiPen to review student documentation and determine the needs for any reasonable accommodations to be provided by DigiPen to ensure equal access. Wherever possible, reasonable accommodations will be offered — provided they neither fundamentally alter the nature of the programs or the academic requirements that are considered essential to the program of study, nor create an undue hardship for DigiPen. The DSS Office will also work with departments, faculty, and staff in the broader DigiPen community to prevent and eradicate discrimination on the basis of disability.

A student requesting accommodation must inform the DSS Office of the existence of a disability and assist the Office in determining appropriate and helpful accommodations and auxiliary aids. They must be prepared to provide documentation of their disabilities to the DSS Office and complete an intake appointment.

TRANSPORTATION AND PARKING INFORMATION

A QUICK REFRESHER: ONLINE PLATFORMS

COLLEAGUE SELF SERVICE

This is the primary administrative platform you'll be using throughout your time at DigiPen. Use your DigiPen student account to log in. This is the place to go to for:

- Registering for classes
- Adding or dropping classes
- · Checking your course schedule
- Making a tuition payment
- · Managing your financial aid

APPLICATION PORTAL

Using the same email login credentials you created when starting your application to DigiPen, this is the place to go for anything related to your application to DigiPen. This includes:

- Submitting final transcripts and other application materials
- Uploading your student ID badge photo

WEBMAIL

If you need to check your DigiPen email, you can access your account from any compatible browser via Webmail. You can also go here for help with setting up a non-browser-based email client.
